

#### ME'NA-ISN Congress 2021 Flu vaccination: New horizons in the outlook

#### **Congress Report**

The MENA-ISN Congress 2021 was held virtually on 22-24 January. The theme of the congress was "Flu vaccination: New horizons in the Outlook ". The congress language was English.

The congress aimed;

- to have a world resilient to pandemic influenza and to establish realistic and implementable influenza programme and pandemic influenza preparedness and response plans in the Region.
- to empower countries to protect their people against influenza threats.
- envisage partnership with and within countries through global and regional initiatives for strengthening the national pandemic influenza preparedness and response capacities.

The congress took place over three days, with day one and day three taking the form of plenary sessions and day two consisting mainly of Networking Sessions.
